RULES

One entry per class, apart from Classes 1 to 5. (2 entries per Class)

Entry Forms can be downloaded from the website www.mid-argyllshow.co.uk.

All exhibits must be in place by 9.45am, and not removed before 4pm.

Every item entered must be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the name and address of the exhibitor. The Class Number of the exhibit must be written on the outside of the envelope.

Exhibitors under 25 years of age should write 'Y' beside their name in the envelope to be eligible for the Centenary Youth Cup.

Floral exhibits should be shown in a suitable vase or container.

Exhibits may be cut open/tasted by the judges to help assess quality.

The tent will close for judging at 10am and reopen on completion of judging.

Prizes should be collected from the tent between 1pm and 4pm.
